INTRODUCTION



HUYAMWI, a ministry under the Lutheran Bible School in Kilimanjaro, Tanzania, is dedicated to supporting orphaned children and equipping them with the foundation for a secure and dignified future. The ministry delivers holistic services that incorporate education, health support, economic empowerment, psychosocial care, and strong community engagement.

Its work is implemented through seven core programs: the Medical Fund, the Education Pool System for school-fee support, Small Income-Generating Projects to enhance self-reliance, structured Orphans' Meetings, life-skill Seminars, Building Support for improved living conditions, and personalized Home Visits.

This picture report summarizes HuYaMwi's key activities and achievements for 2025, presenting visual evidence of progress and meaningful transformation in the lives of the children served. The report underscores the ministry's commitment to accountability, transparency, and impact-driven service.

EDUCATION POOL SYSTEM
